Market Survey & Location

- [] Survey the area for banking needs and existing POS presence
- [] Choose a location with high foot traffic (market, park, estate, etc.)
- [] Confirm network coverage and security of the area

Registration & Documentation

- [] Choose a POS provider (bank or fintech like Moniepoint, Opay, Palmpay)
- [] Visit provider website or physical office to apply
- [] Submit required documents:
 - o [] Valid ID (e.g., NIN, voter's card, driver's license)
 - o [] Recent utility bill (not older than 3 months)
 - [] Passport photograph
 - o []BVN
 - [] CAC certificate (optional but recommended)

POS Machine Setup

- [] Receive your POS device (via delivery or pickup)
- [] Activate terminal with the provider's support
- [] Perform test transactions (withdrawal, airtime, bill payment)

Fund Your Wallet

- [] Start with at least ₩50,000–₩100,000 as transaction capital
- [] Fund wallet using bank transfer or agent app
- [] Plan regular top-ups to avoid running out during peak hours

Business Spot Setup

- [] Secure a kiosk, table, umbrella, or stall
- •[] Get signage: "POS Available Here Withdraw, Send, Pay Bills"
- [] Keep space clean and clearly branded
- [] Provide customer seating (optional, but helpful)

Daily Operation & Recordkeeping

- [] Log daily transactions and profits
- [] Track running balance and wallet funding

- •[] Separate personal and business funds
- [] Stay updated on provider charges and rates

Growth & Expansion

- [] Reinvest profits to grow capital
- [] Monitor and improve customer service
- [] Plan to open additional POS points (if profitable)
- [] Register with CAC if scaling
- [] Network with other POS agents (join forums, WhatsApp groups)
